

Pinwheel Posies Again

List from Pattern:

	Pattern – Pinwheel Posies Again \$8.50 from Easy As Pie Designs
64	Charm Squares or 5” squares of different fabrics
½ yd	fabric <i>each</i> (1½ total) of 3 different colors for flower petals (aqua, orange and green in the pattern photo)
1/3 yd	1 st border (green in photo)
¼ yd	2 nd border (orange in photo)
1 & 1/8 yd	outside border (aqua in photo)
1 & 1/8 yd	bias binding & covered buttons
3 ¼ yd	quilt back
(16)	2” covered buttons (can be purchased from Joann’s or similar store)

NOTE: Above fabric requirements assume 44” width of fabric off the bolt

Other supplies:

- * Working sewing machine, zig zag stitch very helpful
- * Matching thread, wound bobbins, and extra needles
- * Hand sewing needle (not too small/thin)
- * 6” x 1” Omnigrid (or other brand) ruler (if you don’t have this you don’t need to buy it just for this class)
- * Firm cardboard or template plastic (~ 7” x 8”)
- * Fine point permanent marker
- * Fabric marker which will show up on darker fabrics (if applicable)
- * Glue stick
- * Rotary cutter (45mm *and* 28mm)

BEFORE Class:

Step 1 from pattern: Using cardboard or template plastic create template for petals.

[NOTE: the petal shape provided in the pattern is for half a petal, in other words, what the petal will look like after it’s been folded in half. To make the template I copied the petal drawing onto a plain paper, folded the paper along the edge which says “fold line”, then cut around the curved edge. When you open it you have the full petal shape to make your cardboard or plastic template. I tried just cutting the ½ petal shape and aligning it with the fold of the petal fabric, but it seemed like too much work to get an accurate shape and not waste fabric.]

** If you are not using charm packs/squares please cut your fabric into the required (64) 5”x5” squares.

** I suggest you do not cut your border fabric before finishing the construction of the inner quilt. It is more accurate to measure and then cut to the measured size once you know what it is.
