

Quilt Carry Bag

Approximately 33" x 45"

I had fun making this bag which holds *a lot* more than I thought it would!

Supplies:

FABRIC	<p><u>Bag:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Outside:</u> (26) 2½" strips from jelly roll, or 2½" strips, cut across the width of the fabric (WOF). • <u>Lining:</u> 1½ yds matching (to strips) fabric • <u>Handles:</u> ½ yd coordinating fabric. You may want to use the same fabric as the lining. <p><u>Note:</u> I used 27 strips, so you may want to bring extras. Also, if you want a pieced look for the handles (see photo) I use an additional 8 strips.</p>
BATTING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 52" x 33" (NOTE: you may want crib size batting which typically measure 45" x 60", but double check)
COTTON WEBBING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (¾) yds of 1¼" wide cotton webbing
CORDING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (9) ft of 1/8" (3.18mm) cording. (The brand I used is <u>Wrights</u> & I found matching colors @ AC Moore) • (4) cord stops. I used <u>Dritz</u>
BASTING SPRAY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>505 Spray and Fix</i> works very well with minimal smell. Also Sulky KK 2000 Temporary spray adhesive
CLOSURES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (6) Magnetic purse snaps (available @ JoAnn's)
THREAD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coordinating thread for piecing and topstitching

Other supplies:

Turning tool for fabric tubes, and for pulling webbing through casing
 Sewing machine in good working order, and knowledge of how to use it.
 Walking foot
 Rotary cutter & mat
 Rotary cutting rulers - 6x24
 Matching thread, wound bobbins
 General sewing supplies: straight pins, thread snipper
